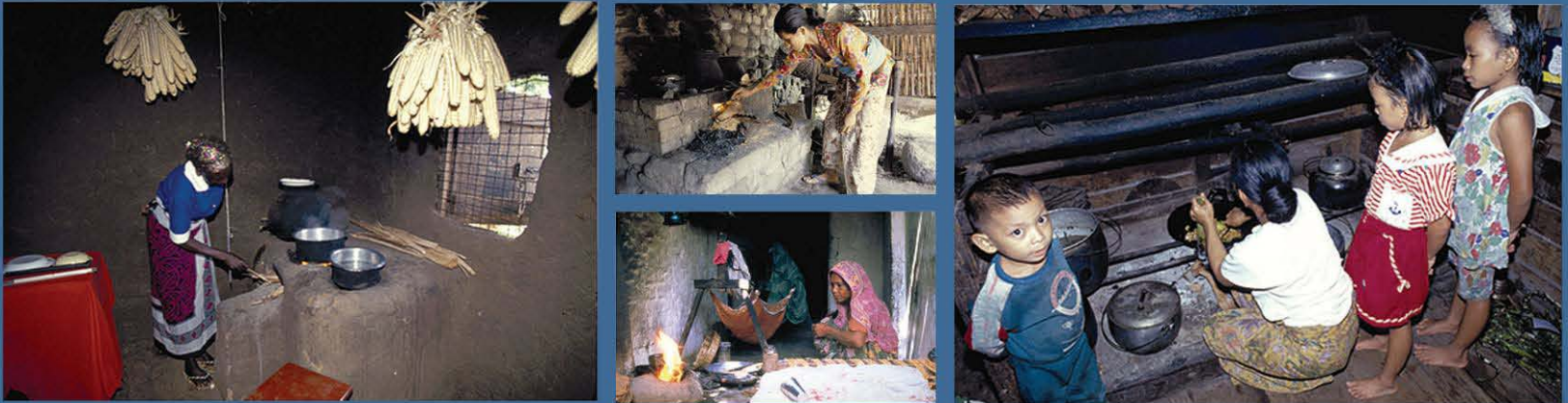


Partnership for Clean Indoor Air



More than 120 Partner organizations working together to improve health, livelihoods and quality of life through reduced exposure to indoor air pollution from household energy use in developing countries.

Outcomes from 2005: Partner Outreach

- Relationships strengthened and resources leveraged to raise awareness and generate action:
 - Practical Action organized seminars at UNEP, USEPA, UK Parliament, and WHO
 - USEPA participated in 2nd International Forum on Partnerships for Sustainable Development
 - GTZ presented the Partnership at the Global Forum for Sustainable Development (GFSE) in Vienna
 - USEPA sponsored two panels of researchers Household Energy at Indoor Air 2005 in Beijing
 - Partners participated in Carbon & Cooking Workshop to explore opportunities to link issues

Outcomes from 2005 (continued)

- Convened 2nd Partner meeting; 60 Partners from around the world participated.
- USEPA prepared PCIA factsheets in English; WHO translated into Chinese and Spanish.
- Winrock International and USEPA
 - Published quarterly PCIA Bulletin
 - Expanded and enhanced PCIA website to include videos, media coverage, etc...
 - Supported Partner participation in capacity building workshops

IAP and HHE Monitoring Outcomes

- WHO, in coordination with other Partners, is finalizing a Catalog of Household Energy and Health Intervention Evaluation Methods.
- The Shell Foundation organized the International Workshop on Rural Energy, Stoves & IAQ in China.
- WHO, USEPA, CEIHD, PAHO, GTZ and Aprovecho co-sponsored regional workshops in Guatemala and Uganda to build capacity of governments and partner organizations NGOs to monitor health and exposure impacts of their interventions.

Stove Design and Performance Outcomes

- USEPA and Aprovecho conducted regional workshops to build capacity of partner organizations to design & produce improved cookstoves:
 - With ARECOP in the Philippines
 - With Peace Corps in Mauritania
- Aprovecho organized their annual Stove Camp to build capacity of participants
- USEPA and Aprovecho conducted emissions and efficiency testing on stoves

Upcoming Milestones:

- IAP Monitoring Meeting to share methods and initial findings of Pilot Projects.
- February - regional workshop in Sri Lanka co-sponsored by WHO, USEPA, and CEIHD to build capacity of partner organizations to monitor health and exposure impacts of their interventions.
- February - regional stove design and performance workshop in Burkina Faso co-sponsored by GTZ, PREDAS, and USEPA.
- May – Commission for Sustainable Development (CSD 14) at the UN – Partners working together to raise awareness of household energy & health, attract new energy & resources.

- Publish “Design Principles for Wood Burning Cookstoves” in Spanish.
- Aprovecho, SF and USEPA publish “Comparing Cookstoves.”
- Publish PCIA Fact Sheets in Arabic and French.
- USEPA and HELPS International -- publish place-based IAP/HHE primary education guide.
- Publish case studies on USEPA pilot projects.
